Common Vaccination Questions and Answers

Who can be vaccinated? CDC recommends COVID-19 primary series vaccines for everyone ages 6 months and older, and COVID-19 boosters for everyone ages 5 years and older, when eligible. People who are moderately or severely immunocompromised have specific recommendations for COVID-19 vaccines, including boosters and should speak to their doctor.

Which vaccines are recommended? There are three highly effective and safe vaccines: Moderna, Pfizer, and Novavax. All require at least two doses plus boosters, and all will protect against the likelihood of infection and against severe disease if infected. Novavax is only approved for persons over 18 at this time, while Moderna and Pfizer are available for all ages. Johnson & Johnson (J&J) is only recommended for some people at this time.

I had COVID already, do I need a vaccine? Yes. While infection usually provides some protection for up to 90 days, it wanes quickly. Vaccines also provide increased protection against severe illness and death.

Is the vaccine free? Yes! In Massachusetts the vaccine is free to everyone regardless of whether or not you have insurance.

Is the vaccine safe? COVID vaccines are very safe for most people. You may have some minor symptoms such as fever, sore arm and headache for a day or two following your vaccination, but severe side-effects are rare and usually seen immediately after vaccination. At this point more than 600,000,000 doses of vaccine have been given in the US.
